

Notes on PA 7 (by Rick Thoman)

Vowels /a/ and /ɔ/ are consistently distinct.

Syllable coda /r/ are generally realized as rhotacization (to varying degrees) of preceding vowel on short vowels and as an approximant following long vowels.

/l/ in /palm/ is vocalized to [pa:m]

No distinction between /w/ and /ʍ/: all realized as [w]

æ is sporadically realized as the diphthong [ɛa], as in:

/bath/ as [bɛaθ]	(additional examples not on this recording include
/mad/ as [mɛad]	/glass/ as [glɛas]
/sad/ as [sɛad]	/ass/ as [ɛas])

but

/fad/ as [fæd]	(additional examples not on this recording include
/had/ as [hæd]	/bat/ as [bæt]
/that/ as [ðæt]	/map/ as [mæp]
/back/ as [bæk]	/wrath/ as [ɹæθ] and /crass/ as [kɹæs])
